Now there is a super kitchen sink with hot and cold water and lovely hygienic cupboards to store everything. No more washing up in an old plastic bowl on a chair!

Sue & Colin also organised the drains and water from the road up to the little Dalia House in Ceausu de Cimpie village, and levelled the floors in the house. It is going to be home to girls with learning difficulties who otherwise often end up as prostitutes. This project is the dream of Anna Kiss who has worked hard getting all the many legal papers required from numerous different offices - endless work simply to provide water and drainage from the road at the bottom of the garden! A team from St Ives centre in Bingley helped work the smallholding, finishing work round the new windows and completely rebuilt the broken, old, concrete steps.

Anna Kiss wrote: "My warmest thanks and deep gratitude to all who help our project come true. Thanks to you all, now we have running water in the kitchen and bathroom as well as the drainage."

Bradford student, Mark Nicholson wanted to help - and bought a first response ambulance car online for Romania. He and fellow student Chris Marshall drove it to Oradea, Romania, where it was received by JOY coordinator, Bill Taylor, for the under equipped ambulance service. Mark works in A & E at Airedale General. He filled the car with medical supplies, and generous staff rallied round with donations, augmented by local firms to cover the cost of the trip. Midgley Motors kindly serviced it free and the RAC provided free European cover. But this is not the end of the story, as supplies continue to be collected to help medical staff in Romania who cannot get the supplies they need. Thank you Mark and all your helpers!

The Glodeni farm

Visiting this village outside Targu Mures for the opening of the latest little home for abandoned youngsters, was a real joy. The newest little house on the farm is bright, modern and very attractive. So now there are four homes on the farm; each a different colour: white, yellow, green and orange; like a child's story book farm! The foundation have created a sports field and a lovely playground in the small field behind the farm, so there is plenty of opportunity for the kids to let off steam! Some of the first youngsters are now in their late teens: please pray about their future - jobs, training, relationships and that they will find faith in Christ.

Harvest of food for the Hungry

Many of you have offered to collect food for the needy folk we seek to help, or to make a food parcel for a destitute old person. Thank you for thinking of them: in spite of Romania being in the EU, many old people don't get any pension if they were farm workers etc and not in a state run industry. So life is frightening for them, as food costs as much as it does here. Anyway a pension may be only £5-10 per month, so coping from day to day can be a worry. Father Paul has only £1.60 per day per child in the little houses, to pay for everything, and Brincovenesti's budget for the handicapped folk has been **cut** 25% in spite of the rising cost of living; so food is a very welcome gift.
